Families can be the most reliable support systems.

If there is someone in your family who struggles with hearing loss, here are some useful tips on how you can help them feel supported.



1. Advocate for them. First ask them about what can make things easier for them when you're in family group situations, then ask them for their permission to share those tips with all family members. This may take pressure off them to ask for help and explain the tips to everyone.
2. If they know sign language, ask them to help you learn.
3. Use simple sentences rather than complex ones to help them understand you more clearly.

Did you know hearing tests can uncover more than hearing loss?

For example, they can help with the diagnoses of health problems such as diabetes as not all hearing loss is due to ageing.

This month we tested a patient's hearing for Cisplatin (chemotherapy drug) monitoring and diagnosed a lady with hearing loss, which indicated a heart condition.

Hearing tests also allow you to track changes in your hearing and to alert you of potential problems such as earwax build up or noise induced hearing loss.

Additionally, if any issues are detected from a hearing test, you can start immediate treatment, which allows you to prevent your hearing from getting worse.

An ear toilet is probably not what you think it is.



While the term ear toilet may sound funny, the process is nothing more than ear wax removal and there is no flush involved!

We have seen a few patients over the past couple of weeks with a fungal infection in their ears. It is important for ears like these to stay dry. Ear cleaning using syringing (with water) is therefore not recommended. The technique that we use at Casey Hearing is dry so these patients felt instant relief after their ears were cleaned by us.
